INTRODUCTION:

Nagaland State Disaster Management Authority, Home Department

Was formally notified and constituted vide notification NO.DM&RR/SDMA/MTG-2011 (Pt) dated 22/11/2011. Ever since its inception from 2011, NSDMA has responded to major disaster incidents across the State, trained many institutions, personnel and touched the pulse of people affected by disasters.

Nagaland is a multi hazard prone State and is vulnerable to events of disaster in varying degrees, to a large number of natural, as well as, human-made disasters on account of its unique geo-climatic and socio- economic conditions. It is highly vulnerable to flash-floods, droughts, cyclones, earthquakes, landslides and forest fires.

Though Nagaland is vulnerable to multi-hazards the State has survived the impact of all such natural phenomenon. Not only survived them but have come out stronger after every such experiences and today, it is the view that there is no such thing as a 'natural disaster' but basically only 'natural hazards'. This further leads to our understanding that we cannot prevent a hazard from happening but we can prevent it from becoming a disaster and that a disaster's severity depends on how much impact a hazard has on society or the environment. The scale of the impact depends on the choices we make for our lives and for our environment.

In the recent past the Extreme Weather events caused extensive damages in Nagaland to agricultural crops, properties and other public utility infrastructures. Such events had rendered thousands of people homeless in various part of Nagaland especially due to flash-floods.

PREAMBLE

In Nagaland disasters disrupt progress and destroy the painstaking developmental efforts, often pushing the State, back by several decades. The efficient management of disasters is of paramount importance to keep the State resilient. This is all the more imperative with the increasing frequency and intensity of disasters. It is with this acknowledgement that capacity building in all spheres of

disaster management is needed to deal effectively with the devastating impact of disasters.

APPROACH

1. A holistic and integrated approach for disaster management capacity building and training with emphasis on building strategic capacity at various levels.
2. The underpinning goal of the training policy of NSDMA, Home Department are;
 - a. Community based Disaster Management Training, including Community First Responders, Village Disaster Management Authorities members, educational institution and church leaders.
 - b. Sectoral capacity development for disaster response and management.
 - c. Cooperation with agencies at national and international levels.

OBJECTIVES

The objectives of the NSDMA training and capacity building on disaster management are:

- a) NSDMA foster to promote a culture of safer and resilience at all levels through knowledge, innovation and education.
- b) To build capacity on technology regime, traditional wisdom and environmental sustainability.
- c) To establish institutional capacity to create an enabling regulatory environment and a compliance regime.
- d) To build efficient mechanism for identification, assessment and monitoring of disaster risks.
- e) To Develop contemporary atmospheric event forecasting and early warning systems with information technology support.
- f) To enhance the capacity of technocrats to undertake reconstruction and build back better resilient infrastructures ensuring safer living.
- g) To promote productive and proactive partnership with media in disaster management.

With this objective the Annual Training Calendar (2024-2025) of the Nagaland State Disaster Management Authority, Home Department is being developed.
